Mounted Shooters to Compete at the AGFD Outdoor Expo By Jana Morris

Mark your calendar for March 26-27, because you and your family will not want to miss the free Cowboy Mounted Shooting competitions at the Arizona Game and Fish Department's Outdoor Expo at the Ben Avery Shooting Facility in north Phoenix.

This crowd-pleasing event features fast horses running one of 63 courses while competitors shoot targets using Old West firearms with blank ammunition. It includes a Wild West show featuring Buffalo Bill Cody talking about firearms and horses of the Old West with a real stage coach and the fast action finals of the Eliminator, Rifle and Cavalry competitions. Many competitors will be dressed in Old West clothing and period Cavalry uniforms.

This is a great event to experience or learn more about Cowboy Mounted Shooting and other amazing outdoor recreational opportunities in Arizona. Activities such as camping, fishing, hunting, wildlife viewing, shooting sports, off-highway vehicle recreation and boating recreation are great ways to spend quality time with family and friends.
